Five partners of Wanhuida Intellectual Property are invited to moderate table topics at the AM.

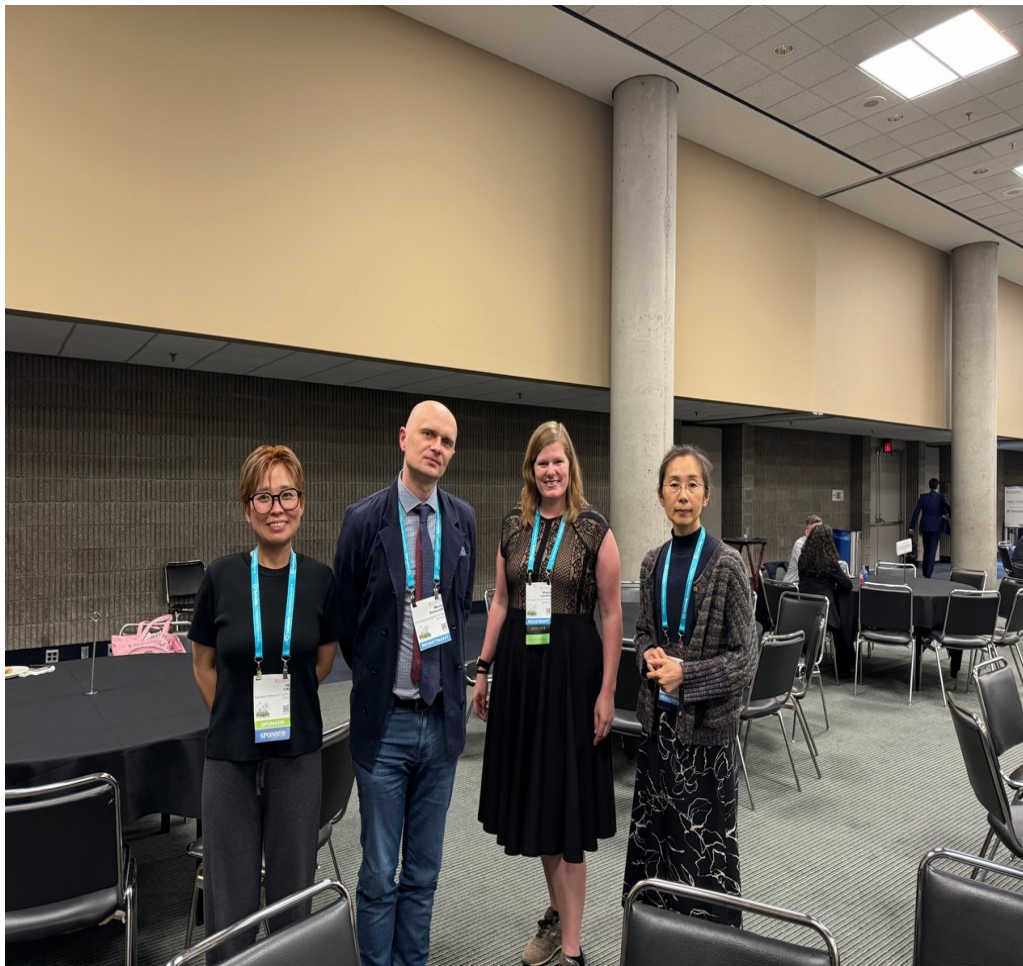
